

Scholarship

Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation offers scholarships each year for students to study in Tanzania and overseas. In 2015, we provided scholarships to about 50 students to study at undergraduate, graduate and post graduate level.

Karimjee Scholars are studying medicine, engineering, finance, computer sciences, business management and a very wide range of academic subjects. Their study progress is monitored and all of them are expected to excel in their studies.

It provides scholarships for doctors to study for the Masters in Pediatric Oncology at MUHAS. One Doctor graduated in 2015 and it is ready give another scholarship in 2016 for the same.

In 2016 the organization will to launch a dual Master's Degree in African Conservation at Nelson Mandela University of Science and Technology Arusha and University of Glasgow in Scotland.

According to officials the scholarship budget of the Karimjee Foundation in 2016 is 700m/-.

Education

In education the foundation provides funding to educational institutions to improve education capacity like funding a learning centre and computer school at Usagara Secondary School in Tanga, financial support to READ International an NGO that builds libraries for secondary schools in Tanzania.

Karimjee Foundation has been an official sponsor of the Young Scientist Tanzania programme since it started in 2012. In addition to providing 60m/- as a Gold sponsor of YST the firm provides science scholarships to the overall winners to go to university once they complete secondary school. It also gives scholarships to winners from special schools in need. Karimjee Foundation has six YST science students at University in 2015.

The Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation is funded by donations from Toyota Tanzania. Toyota Tanzania which supports a long list of activities in healthcare, education, wildlife conservation, the environment, science and technology, arts, sports and road safety.
